JOIN THE EXCAVATIONS AT HORVAT KUR, ISRAEL

18.6.-8.7. 2016

In the years 2010–2015, a team from the Faculty of Theology participated in the excavations of a late-antique synagogue at Horvat Kur, Israel that are conducted by the Kinneret Regional Project. Now, in the summer of 2016, the archaeological excavation will continue and we are searching for students to participate!

The excavation team includes members from Finland, the Netherlands, Belgium, Switzerland, Germany and the United States. The language at the excavations is English. The participation in the excavations and the arranged lectures compensates intermediate studies (aineopinnot) in Biblical studies. During the excavations there are field trips to nearby archaeological sites (e.g. Capernaum, Sepphoris, Tiberias). During the weekends the students are free and may arrange trips, for example, to Jerusalem, Acco or the Dead Sea.

The costs for the full season is € 1300 for students. This fee includes full board and accommodation in air-conditioned rooms (4-5 persons per room) with bathroom. Team members need to arrange their own flights to Israel. It may be possible for the students of theology to get financial support from the Faculty of Theology.

There will be an **information meeting** about the excavations on **Wednesday 27 January**, **16.00–18.00 hours**, at the **Faculty Hall** (5th floor).
